Mary Ellen Riccio, surrogate parent, filed a complaint against the Waterbury Public Schools (district) with the Bureau of Special Education on behalf of the above-referenced student (student) on August 21, 2014. The complaint concerned a publicly funded education evaluation (IEE) of the student. At the time Ms. Riccio filed the complaint, she did not know that had been awarded legal guardianship of the student. It told me over the telephone that she did not think the student needed an independent evaluation and that while she appreciated Mrs. Riccio's efforts, she would not be pursuing an IEE. For this reason, the complaint is dismissed as education decision-making authority has transferred from the surrogate parent to the guardian and the guardian does not support the goal of the complaint; a publicly funded independent education evaluation of the student.
